Like many people, I was convinced that the broad range of health benefits that physical activity offers including weight loss, lower blood pressure and cholesterol levels and hardier immune system. So three times a week, I sweated on a treadmill and exercise bicycle at my local gym. At the end of two months, I was trimmer, more energetic, and felt fitter. If I could accomplish this by working out three times a week, I reasoned, more exercise should bring me even greater benefits.
